5.	Notice of this amendment must be provided to any person lawfully entitled to access to the child at least 30 days before submitting the application. In Ontario, non-custodial parents automatically have access unless a court order or separation agreement specifically states he/she cannot have access. You do not need to send this form to anyone who will get the consent form in item 4 above. If more than one person requires notice, photocopy the blank notice form and provide a separate notice form along with a copy of the completed Application for a Change of Sex Designation on a Birth Registration of a Child and a copy of the completed Statutory Declaration for a Change of Sex Designation on a Birth Registration of a Child to each person being notified of the change of sex designation. Send by registered or certified mail to the last known address of the person entitled to notice.

Alternative Evidence

In lieu of item 6 above, any one of the following documents may be submitted and will be reviewed on a case by case basis:

- I. A document or certificate issued by a jurisdiction in which the child was domiciled or ordinarily resident that, in the opinion of the Registrar General, confirms that the child's gender identity does not accord with the sex designation on the child's birth registration and it is appropriate that the sex designation be changed; or
- II. If the child is not domiciled or ordinarily resident in Canada, such medical evidence that, in the opinion of the Registrar General, confirms that the child's gender identity does not accord with the sex designation on the child's birth registration and it is appropriate that the sex designation be changed; or
- III. A certificate signed by a practising physician authorized to practise in Canada, that complies with the current requirements of s. 36(2) (a) or (b) of the *Vital Statistics Act*.

Resources for Physicians and Psychologists

The Registrar General relies on health practitioners to exercise their own judgment in accordance with their own experience, expertise and contact with the applicant to determine whether a request to change the sex designation on the child's birth registration is appropriate. For additional resources, health practitioners may consult the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH) at www.camh.net and refer to the guidelines established by the World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH), Standards of Care at www.wpath.org.

Personal information contained on this form and other documents submitted with this application is collected under the authority of the *Vital Statistics Act*, R.S.O. 1990 c.V.4, as amended, and may be used to register and record births, stillbirths, deaths, marriages or changes of name, make additions, corrections or amendments to registrations, provide certified copies, extracts, certificates, search notices, photocopies; and for statistical, research, medical, law enforcement, adoption and adoption disclosure purposes. The Ministry of Government and Consumer Services may verify with health practitioners or jurisdictions the information they have provided on the documents in support of this application. It is an offence to wilfully make or cause to be made a false statement on this form and other documents submitted with this application.
